## Doctoral Consortium Consortium Doctoral

The GCITSD 2026 Doctoral Consortium is a one-day interactive event designed to provide doctoral students with valuable opportunities to engage with mentors and peers. Through networking and knowledge exchange, participants will gain insights to support their academic journey. All doctoral students who have begun their Ph.D. programs but have not yet completed their comprehensive examinations are strongly encouraged to submit a proposal.

Each doctoral candidate is required to submit a summary paper that outlines their research. The document must not exceed 10 double-spaced pages and should be formatted as follows: Times New Roman (or equivalent), 11-point font, double spacing (strictly, not 1.5), and 2.54 cm (1 inch) margins on all sides. All pages must be numbered. Submissions that do not comply with these length and formatting requirements will be rejected. The summary should clearly present the research question and provide a justification for its relevance and significance, explaining why the study matters and to whom. It should also include a concise literature review, the theoretical foundation of the work, a research model, and hypotheses (if applicable), as well as the research design, expected results, and anticipated contributions to theory, practice, and policy.

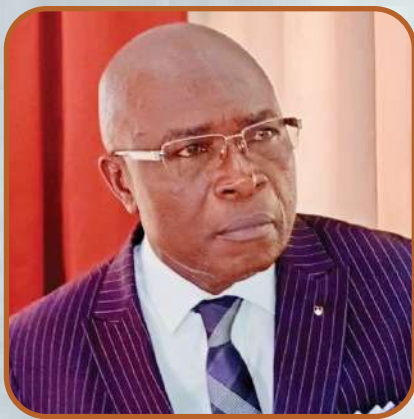

# Keynote Speakers



**Prof. Roger Bernard Onomo Etaba**  
University of Ebolowa, Cameroon

**Roger Bernard Onomo Etaba** is a distinguished Cameroonian academic, holding a Ph.D. in Church History from the University of Yaoundé I and a postgraduate degree in Tourism from Paris I Panthéon-Sorbonne. He is currently Dean of at the Faculty of Letters and Human Sciences, University of Ebolowa, Cameroon. His research spans church history, tourism development, and educational methodology, reflecting a deep commitment to academia and cultural heritage.



**Prof. Chunming Victor Shi**  
Wilfrid Laurier University, Canada

**Chunming (Victor) Shi** is a Professor of Operations Management at the Laurier School of Business and Economics, where he has been a faculty member since 2007. He earned his PhD in Operations Management from Washington State University, a Master of Engineering from the National University of Singapore, and dual Bachelor's degrees in Engineering and Business Administration from the University of Science and Technology of China. His research focuses on supply chain management and management science, with publications in leading journals such as European Journal of Operational Research and IEEE Transactions on Systems, Man, and Cybernetics.



**Prof. Samuel Fosso Wamba**  
TBS Education, France

**Samuel Fosso Wamba** is a full professor of information systems and data science, as well as the associate dean of research at TBS Education in France. He is also a Distinguished Visiting Professor at the University of Johannesburg, South Africa. He earned his Ph.D. in industrial engineering at the Polytechnic School of Montreal, Canada. He is widely regarded as one of the most influential scientists in business and management based on journal publications and citation impact. His research focuses on the business value of information technology, the adoption of inter-organizational systems, their use, and the individual, organizational, and societal effects. His work has appeared in leading information systems and operations management journals, including Best Paper Awards for the Academy of Management Journal (2017), Electronic Market Journal (2017 and 2023). He is a CompTIA RFID+ Certified Professional and ranks in CDO Magazine's Leading Academic Data Leaders 2021.



**A/Prof. Chowdhury Soumyadeb**

**Professor Chowdhury Soumyadeb** is a specialist in Information Management and currently teaches at TBS Education, where he has also led the Centre of Excellence in CSR and Sustainable Development (2021-2024). He earned a PhD in Computer Science from the University of Glasgow (2015), following a Master's in Computer Science (2010) and a Bachelor of Technology in Computer Science and Engineering from Amity University (2009). He also holds a postgraduate certificate in teaching and learning in higher education from Aston University (2018). He is also a faculty member of the International Gestalt Organisation and Leadership Development (iGOLD) Programme, Arizona, USA. He sits on the Editorial Board of the Urban Forum Journal and International Advisory Committee of the Southern Urbanism M.Phil. Programme at the African Centre for Cities (ACC) at the University of Cape Town, South Africa. His social and community engagements include membership of the Governing Boards of Action Aid Ghana (AAG), West Africa Network for Peacebuilding, (WANEP) and the Kumasi Institute of Technology, Energy, and the Environment (KITE). He is a Fellow of the Ghana Institute of Planners (FGIP) and was educated in institutions in Ghana, Germany, Finland, Norway, and the United States of America.



**Prof. Brenda Nachuah Lawyer**  
University of Douala, Cameroon

**Brenda Nachuah Lawyer** is an Associate Professor of Curriculum Studies and Teaching, lecturer in the Advanced Teachers' Training College for Technical Education, University of Douala. Her research spans curriculum development, effective teaching, teacher education and sustainable development. She emphasizes professional growth and pedagogical innovation, especially in response to digital transformation. Her work advocates for inclusive education for marginalized groups and explores how teaching can address contemporary societal challenges. She promotes integrating ICT tools into learning to complement traditional methods. Administratively, she serves as Head of Division for Academic Affairs, Student Records, and Research in the Faculty of Letters and Social Sciences at the University of Douala.



**Prof. René Joly Assako Assako**  
University of Douala, Cameroon

**René Joly ASSAKO ASSAKO** is a Cameroonian geographer, Full Professor at the highest rank, trained at the Universities of Yaoundé, Nantes, Paris 10-Nanterre, and Fribourg. His research covers the African city, environment, health geography, disaster studies (cyndinology), satellite remote sensing, GIS and geomatics. Founder of GREVA, RUBAFRIQUE, and the African Society of Geography (SAG), he promotes the refoundation and Afro-endogenization of geography. Author of 18 books and about 60 scientific articles/chapters, he has supervised hundreds of Master's theses, dozens of doctoral dissertations, and HDR dossiers across Cameroon, Africa, and beyond. He is Vice-Dean of the College of Social Sciences at the Cameroon Academy of Sciences, and member of ASCAD. He has taken part in over 60 conferences, organized 15 scientific meetings (including 7 international), and introduced key concepts: Transcendent Geography, Theory of Diamonds (Existential Rhomboscopy), Assakoism, Diamond Man, and since August 2024, the Geography of Micro-Detail (GMD). Recipient of the Excellence Award of the AUF and the Cameroon Academy of Sciences, he is Officer of the National Order of Valor of Cameroon and Officer of the International Order of Academic Palms (CAMES). After 17 years as Vice-Rector in three State Universities of Cameroon, he is now Dean of the Faculty of Letters and Human Sciences, University of Douala.



**Prof. Glenn Richey**  
Auburn University, USA

**Glenn Richey** is the Harbert Eminent Scholar in Supply Chain Management and Research Director at the Center for Supply Chain Innovation, Auburn University. He earned his PhD in Supply Chain Management and Marketing from the University of Oklahoma (2003), MBA from Middle Tennessee State University (1998), and BS in Marketing from the University of Alabama (1992). With prior industry experience at Scott Paper Co. and Genuine Parts Company, he bridges academia and practice through research and teaching. A widely published scholar with international teaching experience across six continents, he has received multiple awards for excellence in research, teaching, and editorial leadership.



**Prof. Atsa Etoundi**  
University of Yaoundé I, Cameroon

**Professor Roger Atsa Etoundi** is a Cameroonian academic and expert in information systems and software engineering. He is a full professor and Head of the Department of Computer Science at the University of Yaoundé I, where he also leads the Division of Information Systems at the Ministry of Higher Education (MINESUP). He earned his PhD in Computer Science in 2004 and has published extensively on digital transformation, student mobility management, and inter-organizational process optimization. Professor Etoundi has contributed to the development of digital infrastructure in Cameroonian universities, including the TAGDev 2.0 project, and actively promotes strategies for inclusive and sustainable digital economy development in Africa.



**Prof. Constantine Blome**  
Stockholm School of Economics, Sweden

**Professor Constantine Blome** is a distinguished academic in the field of supply chain management, currently serving as a Professor in the Department of Entrepreneurship, Innovation, and Technology at the Stockholm School of Economics (SSE), Sweden. His research focuses on sustainable supply chains, procurement, and operations management, with a strong emphasis on innovation and risk management. He has been recognized as one of the top 0.1% most cited scholars globally, receiving the Clarivate Highly Cited Researcher award in 2020, 2021, and 2023. In addition to his academic role, Professor Blome is the Co-Editor-in-Chief of the International Journal of Operations & Production Management and has held leadership positions at institutions such as Lancaster University Leipzig and the University of Sussex Business School. He is also involved in industry through his roles as co-owner and board member of two companies: n-side (Belgium) and Procurement (Poland).



**Dr. Temilade Sesan**  
University of Lagos, Nigeria  
(African Cities Research Consortium)

**Dr Temilade Sesan** holds a Ph.D. in Sociology and Social Policy from the University of Nottingham, UK. Her research interrogates the social, political and cultural dimensions of sustainable development initiatives in the areas of housing, transport and urban infrastructure – particularly as they intersect with issues of gender and informality in Africa. Temilade has received funding for her research from the African Research Universities Alliance, the International Network for Government Science Advice, the International Science Council, the Partnership for Economic Policy, and UK Research and Innovation. She has published extensively on pathways to co-creating inclusive urban development with marginalised groups. She currently leads the Lagos city team at the African Cities Research Consortium, a programme of the UK Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office led by the University of Manchester and implemented by the Centre for Housing and Sustainable Development at the University of Lagos.



**Prof. Koffi Brou Emile**  
University Alassane Ouattara, Côte d'Ivoire

**Professor Brou Emile Koffi**, a distinguished scholar at Alassane Ouattara University in Côte d'Ivoire, combines academic excellence with strong institutional leadership. As Director of Planning, Monitoring, and Evaluation at UAO, he also oversees training within the UNESCO Chair "Anticipation, Foresight and Sustainable Territories." A recognized expert in quality assurance, he serves as evaluator for ANAQ-ESR and contributes to various academic commissions. Deeply engaged in scientific research, he leads prominent laboratories and academic journals, while actively participating in learned societies and regional research networks across Africa, thus fostering innovation, collaboration, and the advancement of knowledge in the social sciences.



**Prof. Henri Sourou Totin Vodounon**  
University of Parakou, Benin

**Henri Sourou TOTIN VODOUNON** is a Full Professor of Physical Geography at the University of Parakou (Benin), where he teaches and researches Climatology and Environment. Since 2010, he has been an Associate Researcher at the Pierre PAGNEY Laboratory (LACEEDE), University of Abomey-Calavi, specializing in climate and water sciences. He serves as Lecturer-Researcher in the Department of Geography and Land Use Planning (DGAT), Faculty of Letters, Arts and Human Sciences (FLASH), and is Director of the Laboratory of Climatology and Ethnoclimatology (Labo ClimET-UP), University of Parakou. He is also a Member of the Climate and Environment Commission of the National Academy of Sciences, Arts and Letters of Benin (ANSALB). His research focuses on: climate evolution (variability and change), hydrometeorological and climatic risks, water availability (quantitative and qualitative), global environmental change and related risks, sanitation and hygiene in urban areas. He is author and co-author of numerous peer-reviewed and indexed journal articles and conference papers.



**Prof. Abdulhameed Danjuma Mambo**  
Nile University of Nigeria

**Prof. Abdulhameed Danjuma Mambo** is a Nigerian academic specializing in Civil and Building Engineering. He earned his B.Eng. in Civil Engineering (2006, Federal University of Technology Minna), an M.Sc. in Building Services Engineering with distinction (2009, Loughborough University, UK) through a PTDF merit scholarship, and a Ph.D. in Civil and Building Engineering (2013, Loughborough University). He is Professor and Dean of the Faculty of Environmental Sciences at Nile University of Nigeria, Abuja, and also Head of the Department of Civil Engineering. His research interests include sustainable infrastructure, smart cities, building energy efficiency, and artificial intelligence in building systems. 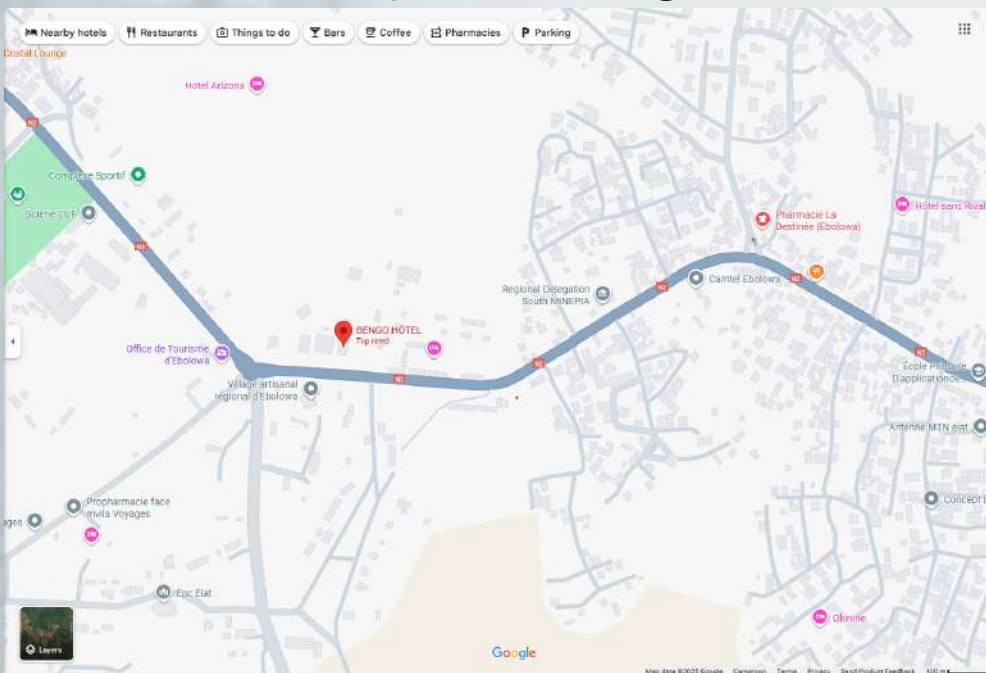
